Who are We?

The Pennsylvania Environmental Resource Consortium, or PERC, is comprised of over fifty member and affiliated Pennsylvania colleges and universities (see list of specific institutions in Appendix A) working to build a more sustainable future on their campuses, throughout Pennsylvania and around the world. PERC participants include member representatives and their colleagues from a variety of campus roles including faculty, sustainability staff, administration and facilities management as well as people from PERC's sponsors.

Our Mission Statement

PERC enables Pennsylvania's colleges and universities to share knowledge and take action towards a sustainable future.

History

PERC was founded in 2000 and during its

first decade amassed an impressive string of organizational accomplishments. PERC's achievements range from being instrumental in the introduction of wind power to Pennsylvania, to partnering in solar development on campus, to GHG inventories for campuses and surrounding municipalities to stream remediation to student engagement in recycling competitions—and much more. A more detailed account of PERC's historic achievements is included at the end of this document as Appendix B. In early 2010, PERC began a strategic organizational development plan called ReVision 2010 as described on our website: www.pagreencolleges.org. Event Sponsorship overview

Event sponsors support a particular event. They receive a number (the specific number varies with the chosen sponsorship level) of free registrations to the event allowing for networking. Sponsors are identified visually on all communications regarding the event (email, signage, program handouts) and recognized orally during the event. A contact list of all attendees is provided to each sponsor. (See the Event Sponsorship chart (blue heading) later in this document for specifics and differentiation between levels.)

Annual Sponsorship overview

The annual sponsorship is designed to allow the sponsor to become more fully involved in PERC on a continuing relational basis. Annual sponsors have many of the same privileges as colleagues from PERC member institutions, like full access to the website, including the members-only section, ability to post a profile about you and your expertise and the ability to add a page to the PERC about your organization. Depending on the level of sponsorship, Annual Sponsors are given a variety of promotional opportunities throughout the year, including in many cases Event Sponsorship. *The event sponsorship alone can also, in some levels, justify the investment in annual sponsorship.* Annual sponsors are able to effectively share news about their industry, including new trends, products and other solutions to

sustainability. Annual sponsors also receive free registration for all PERC events—conferences and webinars. (The number of people from an organization with privileges varies by sponsorship level.) Many sponsoring organizations will find that they are able to justify the sponsorship fees based on this benefit alone—they find investing in a PERC annual sponsorship saves money when compared to registering for each PERC event. In addition to the networking opportunities provided by events, annual sponsors are encouraged to serve on PERC teams, to enhance the depth of their connections in the organization. All sponsors are given recognition on the PERC Sponsors page and some levels have logo placement on other site pages as well. And each PERC Sponsor is eligible to participate in the Sponsor Council, a three time per year meeting with the Executive Director to seek input about PERC from its Sponsors. (See the Annual Sponsorship chart (green heading) later in this document for specifics and differentiation between levels.)

Sustaining Annual Sponsorship overview

The Annual Sustaining sponsorship contains all of the benefits and opportunities listed above, but offers more iterations of each. For example, instead of receiving a Top Level event sponsorship for one or three conferences, for example, the Sustaining Sponsorship is guaranteed to be one of the Top Level sponsors for every event PERC holds throughout the year. In addition to first placement on the PERC Sponsor Page, PERC’s Sustaining Sponsors will have logo placement on the home page (up to four sponsors can place logos on the home page on a “rank/seniority” basis) or other highly trafficked PERC page. (See the Annual Sponsorship chart (green heading) later in this document for specifics and differentiation between the Sustaining Annual and other annual levels.)

Additional Opportunities at half-price

Sponsors will receive first offering of any additional promotional opportunities. All such additional opportunities will be offered to current sponsors at half-price before offering to non-sponsors at full price. One exception to this is the Sustaining Sponsor, who will already receive any and all added promotional opportunities at no cost during the period of their Sponsorship.

APPENDIX B: PERC Accomplishments

PA Higher Ed Food Recovery Challenge (PHE-FRC)

PERC, in partnership with the U.S. EPA and Sustaining Sponsor Sodexo, created this unique initiative to minimize food waste, alleviate hunger, and reduce greenhouse gases. In 2015, PERC won the EPA's national Endorser of the Year award for creating this unique program.

Food Recovery Challenge

Wind Power Market Development

PERC, along with its member schools, was responsible for the initial creation of a market for wind power in Pennsylvania.

Greenhouse Gas Inventory & Reduction

PERC developed a program on Greenhouse Gas Inventories and Reduction Strategies to share experiences among schools to achieve very aggressive GHG reduction goals.



Sustainable Development Network for PA

PERC convened 12 institutions within PERC--institutions that have resolved to support sustainable development activities in numerous communities in Pennsylvania.

Municipal Greenhouse Gases Inventories and Reduction Strategies

Six PERC schools worked with approximately 25 municipalities on developing and executing municipal approaches to Greenhouse Gas Inventories and Reduction Strategies.

Energy Efficiency

PERC's Climate Change and Clean Energy committee organized and executed eight well-received workshops on Energy Efficiency over the course of two years.

Solar Power Development

PERC has been instrumental in developing Solar Power: PERC worked with the Sustainable Energy Fund of Central Eastern Pennsylvania to create and fund the Solar Scholars Program. SEF recently described it as one of their most successful programs.

Watershed Protection

PERC obtained a \$300,000 grant from EPA to four PERC schools to assess the impacts of lack of land use controls on PA watersheds.
